Thanks for everything, Mike.


Replacement Caretaker

Soil Stabilisation

Soil stabilisation is a problem in both the northern and southern areas.

In the southern area there are areas that have mainly paspalum growing at the backs and fronts of hangars. Hangar owners are asked that those areas are made "mowable". By that I mean that the rocks are removed, and/or top soil is added so that the grass and weeds can be mown without damaging the mower. If this is done then the mowing may be done more often.

Please also clean up down the sides of hangars regularly to reduce fire hazards and the build up of rubbish. Items that are not gas bottles or BBQs must be placed inside hangars.





Hi John,

Currently I am conducting research into the introduction and use of so called glass cockpits in general aviation. The survey is based on a survey conducted in the USA by a NASA researcher. The results were published in the International Journal of Aviation Studies and I hope to be able to follow up with a similar article based on the Australian experience. Colleagues are running the same survey in South Africa and we want to be able to do an international comparison.
