From the Secretary's Desk

Hullo everyone.

Fire Mitigation

After a meeting with Scott Deller, Community Safety Officer for the Wollondilly Rural Fire Service, I draw member's attention to the following:

- There is very little likelihood that there will be a hazard reduction burn to the west of the airfield this year. Please read about your responsibilities below. Generally the airfield is in good shape to withstand fire events with some hangars, hangar rows and areas displaying "best practice" fire management.
- The next workday will include many hazard reduction and asset protection activities around the airfield.

Fire Mitigation for Hangar Owners:

All buildings on the airfield are vulnerable to ember attack from a fire coming from the south or the west. Here are some things that hangar owners can do to reduce the impact of such an ember attack:

- Clean out you gutters
- Mow lawns, remove saplings, prune shrubs and rake up leaf litter and sticks. The Rural Fire Service will be issuing us with a Hazard Reduction Certificate in the near future which will allow us to burn. In the mean time, if you have material that you have cleaned up around hangars or any other area please stack it in 2mX2m piles so that it can be disposed of when we receive the necessary certificate. Please don't burn it yet.
- If you have gas bottles outside you hangar, point the safety valve away from buildings.

Club Rule Changes

At the General Meeting on Sunday, 20th September the following votes were taken on proposed rule changes. A 75% majority was needed for each motion to be carried.

MOTION "That the club rules are amended to include the following:

Rule 47c(ii) Social members who attend workdays will have their workday fees, up to an amount determined by the committee, credited against their joining fee when they join." There were 47 votes for and 8 against. The motion was carried.

MOTION "That the club rules are amended to state:

Rule 47(e) Each (Full category) club member may <u>own</u> two aircraft hangars on club property subject to the availability of hangar sites and club rules regarding lease of sites and construction of hangars." There



were 53 votes for and 1 vote against. The motion was carried.

MOTION "That the club rules be amended to state:

Rule 11 Disciplining of members

(a) A complaint may be made to the committee by any person that a member of the association:

(i) has refused or **persistently neglected** to comply with a provision or provisions of these rules, or

(ii) **has willfully acted** in a manner prejudicial to the interests of the association."

Three members requested that there be a secret ballot. Noel Carmody conducted the ballot. There were 23 votes for and 38 votes against. The motion was not carried.

I will notify the Dept of Fair Trading of the two rule changes that members voted for.

Northern Toilet Blocks

Our thanks go to Tim Causer who has submitted plans for two toilet blocks in the northern precinct to Wollondilly Shire Council along with a Development Application for the septic system that will service the entire northern area. The first toilet block will be built in row V between hangar V! and V2 and the second one in row P, beside hangar P3. The septic line will follow the line of the road. Hangar owners will need to install tanks at the end of rows (if needed) that will hook into the septic line and join into the transpiration bed that will be situated at the end of hangar row Z. The committee hopes to begin construction of the first toilet block and the septic line in the near future if and when the DA is approved by the council.

A little bit of house keeping

As you would appreciate, there is a

lot that needs to be done in this role, and there are a few really simple things that YOU can do to make my job just a little easier. Please keep these few things in mind next time you...

...fill out the fuel book:

please <u>write clearly</u>, this will minimise the chance of errors in transcription on your invoice

ensure that the <u>divider is in place</u> so that only one copy of your purchase is recorded

...send a cheque with a copy of your invoice/statement:

please <u>do not staple</u> the cheque to the paperwork, this will save me from having to remove the staples in order to bank your cheque (if necessary, use a small amount of sticky tape or a paper clip instead)

...send a cheque without a copy of your invoice/statement:

- please <u>write invoice number(s) on</u> <u>the back</u>, this will ensure that the money you send will be put against the correct invoice
- ...club house mailbox
- Don't forget the club has an internal mailbox located next to the biscuits. We encourage members to take advantage of this when on the airfield. You can use the mailbox to drop cheques to me. You can also use it to drop letters/paperwork to the committee (save you trying to find the committee member you are af-



ter or pay postage). You can also use this to drop your contributions and photos for future newsletters!!

Work / Social Day Activities

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Hello Everyone,

As I write this, we are approaching the last Social/ Workday for 2009, which by the way, will be on Sunday 25th October. As everyone is aware, there has been a lot of talk throughout the media recently that this summer is going to be a hot one and, one in which severe fires, specifically in our region, could be a reality. With his in mind, and whilst we will have a few jobs that need attention in preparation for the Open Day in November, we really need to concentrate on Fire Hazard Reduction around the airfield. It's a given, as reported by local fire authorities, that the fire break (known as the runway) is sufficient for fires approaching from the west to give us a safety buffer, which by the way is the usual trend in Sydney as I understand it – fires generally travel west to east. Having said that, what we need to concentrate on is the bush areas close to the hangars, clubhouse and other important infrastructure (like the water tank and feeder lines for instance). So as you can see, the focus on this last social/workday will be mainly directed toward Asset Protection, more so than what's been happening earlier this year. Please come prepared in protective clothing, and bring along any tools like rakes, shovels, and any other suitable tooling you might have to make this day a fruitful one with regard to this fire reduction activity. Those who have, and can supply trailers to assist with the moving of the cleared out waste are asked to bring them along on the day, as we always seem to have an issue with clearing away the spoil when this work is undertaken

A note on accruals for Social/Workday Credits – a number of people have met the required 3 day no financial loss limit, and there are a number that are close. There is a list of the "almost current" situation on the website. I say almost, as there have been some minor changes for a few members who have completed individual credits since the last social/workday that will not show up on this list is again updated on the club site after 25^{th} October, so to those few people who have sent me emails, your credits have been updated on the master, its just the



club site, has not been updated as yet. 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


VALE - ALAN WILLIAM CRAMPTON 13th March 1926 – 29th July 2009

Our wonderful Club has been saddened at the passing of another foundation member. Alan (younger brother of Gordon, the club's first elected President) joined the Sport Aircraft Club, like others, whilst a member of the SAAA and for over 25 years became a valuable and dedicated member of SAC.

With other members, Alan became a regular team member of several established working groups who came out almost every weekend to attend to so many of the projects that were on the drawing board to be done. In our early days there was always so much to be done and you could always depend on Alan to be there to assist.



Before our Lease was signed on 20th September 1978, Alan with Patricia had read an advertisement, in a Saturday's Sydney Morning Herald, that the ex RAAF Officers Mess at Bankstown Airport was "FOR SALE". Alan immediately contacted the SAC Caretaker Committee suggesting they make an offer to purchase this building as it would make an ideal Clubhouse for our members. After we became the successful buyer of this prized building, the Wollondilly Shire Council had to be approached to gain permission to resite our acquisition to the proposed airfield at Wedderburn, as our lease had still not been signed. As luck had it all the necessary paperwork was approved and the moving from Bankstown to Wedderburn of the two buildings took place.

We never looked back, as not only did we have a Clubhouse for our members to gather together in but Caretakers Quarters as well. It was the best purchase we ever made for the Club and this building has suited our needs for 30 years and am sure it will last another 30 years. We have Alan and Patricia to thank for making this all possible.

In March 1979, one month after the Inaugural General Meeting of SAC, the Committee held a competition to find a badge suitable for use as a logo and letterhead, or car sticker, and as a cloth badge. Up to four colours could be used and the competition was open to all financial SAC members. In May 1979 a Club Badge design submitted by Alan was chosen as the winner from 5 other members who had also entered the competition. It is a most beautiful design of an eagle with outstretched wings that Alan drew, he was the worthy winner and it makes us very proud to wear our Club Badge on our Polo Shirt and Cap.

On checking the old Newsletters it seems Alan received the grand total of \$10.00 as winner, I guess that was all that could be given as money was very tight in those early days.

During the 70's Alan began to build his own aircraft, a Thorp T.18. VH - BUB was com-

pleted in 1977 to much fanfare, and together with Patricia many trips, over many years to various air shows around Australia saw Alan there with his beautiful aircraft on display. Unfortunately, time and illness caught up with Alan and so his pride and joy was sold to a Thorp T 18 enthusiast who was a very competent pilot and Alan knew his aircraft would be in good hands.

As most of you know after our Club was established in 1979 for the next 20 years we held Fund Raising functions in the Clubhouse, in the beginning almost every weekend and then every few months as the bank balance grew. Alan and Patricia were always there to participate and support the Club.

Alan was well enough to attend the two functions we held, in September 2008 and again in March this year, to celebrate the Club's 30th Anniversary and together with Patricia were delighted to see and mingle with so many of our past members who were present.

We thank Alan for having been a wonderful member of SAC and for all he did to

make sure our Club would continue to prosper. Alan was a Peaceful, Bright, Fair & Harmonious Gentle Man.

To Patricia our love and sincere sympathy are with you at this sad time and we will never forget Alan.
