A Message from your Safety Officer

Wake Turbulence on Takeoff

Which wind condition requires maximum caution with regard to wake turbulence on takeoff?

- No wind
- Light crosswind
- Strong crosswind



Vortices tend to move outward from the aircraft. So if you are behind a departing aircraft, the vortex from the right wing will tend to move to the right. The vortex from the left wing will tend to move to the left in no wind conditions.

If we have a crosswind, the wind will tend to influence the movement of the vortices. A crosswind of about 3 knots will hold the upwind vortex pretty much in place at the runway where it was created, while the downwind vortex will rapidly move away from the runway.

Crosswinds greater than approximately 5 knots will tend to break up the vortices. So stronger crosswinds are good things, as far as vortices are concerned. At least the way we look at it, from our perspective; we want the vortices to begin to break up and decay. So light crosswinds require maximum caution, and I'm talking about a light crosswind of maybe 3 knots.

We need to note the point of rotation of the larger aircraft. That point of rotation is where the vortices will be developed. From that point on,



there will be vortices off the wings of that departing aircraft. So it's important that your rotation point occurs prior to the rotation point of the preceding aircraft, because we do not want to be rotating in the vortices of the preceding aircraft. We need to do that prior to reaching the preceding aircraft's point of rotation.

You need to climb upwind of the departing aircraft for the same reason we talked about relative to the crosswind's effect on the vortices. So if the crosswind will move the vortices to the left, our departure path should be to the right to avoid those vortices.

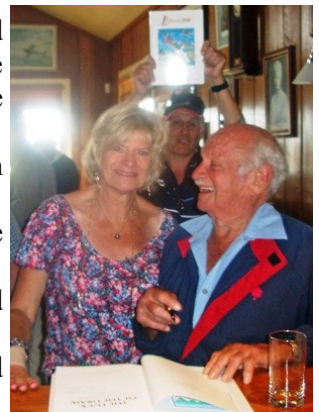
ley Laybutt, Dave Thomas, Ian Harvie, Doug Montague, Gary Malane, Rod Russell and Jim Booth.

Farewell to Randall Krebs

Randall Krebs was in the merchant navy, a merchant seaman, a ship's engineer. He was a pilot for over 25 years and joined our club nearly ten years ago.

In recent times he flew a Zenith ZZZ, but was in the process of building a Jodel, a variant known as the FDR 250 Monarch which is a design conceived by Frank Rogers.

On SAAA 'builders night' where the members visited his home at Dural there were always comments about the immaculate organisation of his workshop and equipment, and the outstanding quality of his workmanship.

Randall was a quite brilliant engineer, he relished a challenge and he never took the easy way out. He was meticulous with his attention to detail and he did not seek or need any recognition for his good deeds.

He had a delightful Australian sense of humour, and was generous with his time whilst giving others the benefit of his considerable engineering ability and expertise.

Randall contracted leukaemia last year, and initially responded well to the treatment to the point where it was believed that he was cured, but then some months later the disease returned so aggressively that he was unable to overcome it.

Our member, Peter Lightbown, wrote: *"Randall was a gentle soul with great inner strength, a calm and capable person who quietly did what needed to be done."*

Randall was a model citizen of our aviation community, setting an example for all of us to follow. He was much loved, will be sorely missed and will never be forgotten.

Our prayers and thoughts reach out to Judy, Karl and his extended family.
