March General Meeting

The March General Meeting will be held in the Clubhouse at Wedderburn on Sunday 8th March, 2009 commencing at 2.00pm.

There is a **notice of motion** for the General Meeting as follows:

"that the motion to locate a new fuel bowser in the middle of the aircraft park-

ing area be rescinded" moved by John Duncan and seconded by Vic Laybutt.

Just to put this motion in context for new members and those who may have forgotten in September 2006 43 members of the 79 represented at a General Meeting voted to place a new fuel bowser, when it became available, to the east of the windsock in the aircraft parking area. Since then there have been extensive changes to the infrastructure of the airfield including taxiways and drainage. The committee feels that the placement of the fuel bowser needs to be revisited, and this motion (if it is accepted by the members) will remove the previous motion from the books and allow other alternatives to be considered.

2009 Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting will be held in the Clubhouse at Wedderburn on Sunday 8th March, 2009 immediately following the General Meeting. Items of business for this meeting are

Sunday 1st March to receive any late nominations.

The nominee, the proposer and the seconder must be financial members of the SAC.

If you think that you can contribute your time, ideas and expertise to the workings of the club, please nominate for the management committee.

A **Proxy form** is also enclosed with this newsletter. This form must be filled out correctly, indicating which meetings it is relevant for, and must be signed by the member that cannot attend the meeting. Proxies must be received by the Secretary or the Returning Officer before the meeting begins either by mail or by hand or from the person holding the proxy, however the <u>completed</u> form must be an original. It cannot be faxed or emailed. The member holding the proxy and the member giving the proxy must be financial members of the club.

Thank you to those who have contributed so far.

Hangar Compliance

In August last year, letters went out to all hangar owners regarding hangar compliance, ie guttering and downpipes, soil preservation, rubbish and goods outside hangars and so on. I'd like to thank those hangar owners who made an effort to make their hangars and their surrounds compliant with the terms of their leases and contributing to the aesthetics of the airfield. Unfortunately, however some hangars are still non-compliant in some areas. More letters will be sent out in the next couple of weeks. These letters will give hangar owners 30 days to rectify their problems or the Committee has determined that a fine of not less than \$100.00 will apply. I would urge your assistance with this matter. We need downpipes, tanks and rusty gutters fixed, soil stabilised and rubbish removed.

Soil stabilisation is a problem in both the northern and southern areas. The drainage is not yet complete for the northern area but it should be installed in the next few months.

In the southern area there are areas that have mainly paspalum growing at the backs and fronts of hangars. Hangar owners are asked that those areas are made "mowable". By that I mean that the rocks are removed, and/or top soil is added so that the grass and weeds can be mown without damaging the mower. If this is done then the mowing may be done more often. Please also clean up down the sides of hangars regularly to reduce fire hazards and the build up of rubbish. Items that are not gas bottles or BBQs must be placed inside hangars.

I look forward to your company at the General and Annual General Meeting on 8th March. Be there and have your say about how your club grows and prospers.

Treasurer's Report

Happy new year everyone!

THANK YOU to all those members that have already paid their 2009 annual subs. Your paying on time makes my job SO much easier. As some of you may already know, Bernie and I are expecting our second child in early 2009. What's more, this is the busiest time of the club's year for the treasurer - combination of chasing annual subs and getting the club's records audited (not to mention chasing a very mobile one year old while 7 months pregnant and working full time). Although all members should always pay their annual subs on time, as a special request for 2009 please pay your annual subs on time to help minimise the amount of extra work I need to do.

2009 ANNUAL SUBS: How to pay them?

Annual subs for 2009 were emailed to members on 31 December from t h e e m a i l a c c o u n t fly.bcy@bigpond.net.au and are to be paid to the club by 31 January. Payment of annual subs can be by EFT direct to the club's bank account, direct deposit into the club's bank account at any NAB, or cheque posted to the club's PO Box or left in the clubhouse mailbox. The club's bank account details can be found at the bottom of your statement.

Old club house keys

Thank you to those members that returned their old keys last year as requested. Those members received a \$30 credit on their 2009 annual subs. Have you still got your old club house key? This key is no longer in use on the airfield so is no use to you. If you still have your key and would like a refund please return it by either leaving it in an envelope with your name on it in the club house mailbox OR post it to the club's PO Box (make sure your name is somewhere) OR hand your key in an envelope with your name on it to a committee member.

Unpaid subs WILL incur a late fee...

Members that have not paid their annual subs by 31 January will receive notice of a late fee and be ineligible to vote (or stand for a committee position) at the upcoming General and Annual General Meetings in March if payment is not received by 28 February. So, if you have not yet paid your annual subs DO SO NOW.

Haven't received yours yet?

If you have not received your annual subs for 2009 yet please contact me urgently – or you will be invoiced a late fee.

Not planning on renewing your membership in 2009...

If you do not intend to renew your membership, please be so kind as to let me know so that I don't waste my time chasing you for money (I do actually have better things to be doing).

Will you have difficulty paying your 2009 annual subs on time?

If you will have difficulty paying your 2009 subs on time you need to contact me NOW. The only way to avoid a late fee is to either pay your subs on time, or advise me – before late fees are invoiced – that you need extra time to pay. Once late fees have been invoiced it will be too late to seek an extension for payment and you run the very real risk of loosing your membership.

CLUB AUDITS: The club is being audited by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

We certainly had a big spend up last year (sealing the runway and taxiways) and didn't the ATO notice when I lodged our BAS for that quarter asking for a refund of nearly \$30,000! I worked really hard to get this BAS statement into the ATO within a couple of days of the quarter ending to in turn get this money into the club's bank account ASAP



and needed an audit from the ATO like I needed a hole in my head. The club has provided the ATO with all the documents and data they requested and we now await the outcome of the audit. Despite giving the club only 48 hours to respond to their request, the ATO expect to take a couple of weeks before getting back to us – perhaps I should invoice them for lost bank interest!!!!!

End of club financial year.

For those that are not aware, the club's financial year runs 1 Feb through to 31 Jan. As such, we have now reached the end of the financial year for the club's accounts. I am now in the process of finalising all the books to go to the club's auditor such that we can have the clubs accounts audited in time for the Annual General and General meetings in March.

SUMMARY OF BUDGET OUT-COMES:

Overhead & Maintenance Budgets...in 2008/09

Both the overhead and maintenance budgets overall finished the year with dollars to spare. The only items to go over budget were garbage, donations, subscriptions and stationary. The garbage budget ran over courtesy of a few inconsiderate members that put all their rubbish from inside their hangars onto a club pile of rubbish that appeared after one work day where members picked up rubbish from outside recalcitrant hangar owners hangars – this required the club to hire a skipbin to remove what ended up being a very large amount

of rubbish – otherwise we would have finished on budget. Donations ran over as we raised more money on the gate at open day than originally anticipated – great news for Angel Flight. Due to a change in our website hosting arrangements our subscriptions were higher than expected for this year, we would expect them to be a little lower next year. An increase in copying costs and newsletter circulation are the primary reason for the high stationary costs – this has been addressed in next years budget.

Capital Projects Budget...in 2008/09

Isn't the airfield looking great – thanks to all those members involved in all the various projects last year, not just for your contribution to the club, but also to ensuring we remained within budget. The projects completed in 2008 included sealing the runway and taxiways, water reticulation, NW boundary fence, regrading of the southern road and the emergency evacuation plan.

As you may recall the committee, with your approval, budgeted \$197,000 to seal the runway. This budget for the runway did not include a full width / full length hotmix finish. This full hotmix finish was conditional upon those members that really wanted it donating it to the club. Thank you to all those members that wanted a hotmix runway and donated \sim \$55,000 towards it — we have only one outstanding pledge. At the end of the day (when all pledges have come in) we will have come in on budget for this project.

The only completed capital project to run over budget in 2008 was the sealing of the taxiways. The main reason for this was a change to the taxiway requirements (extra bit here, further straightening there, and some repair work) that was not in the original budget spec. It was never recosted, and so this item's budgeted amount was never changed – although these changes to the taxiway requirements were approved by the committee. The overrun was as expected for the extra work that was done.

Bank balance...in 2008/09

The club's bank account went from a high of nearly \$450,000 in September to a low of \$80,000 by the beginning of January 2009. As annual subs for 2009 are coming in the bank balance is slowly increasing again ahead of 2009 expenses. We currently have nearly \$170,000 in the bank and \$130,000 in outstanding invoices.

The 2009/10 Budget

The overhead budget for 2009 was decreased by \$22,500 overall as a direct result of the expected BAS refund that now will not go into the club's account until February. Excluding this item the overhead budget was otherwise increased by \$6,500 to account for increased expected costs associated with insurance, head lease payments, stationary, garbage and function expenses. There was no change made to the maintenance budget from 2008. The total budgeted cost to run the club (excluding any capital works) in 2009 is \$96,100 (this assumes the club will receive the full BAS refund).

Based on a predicted income of \$180,000-\$200,000 in 2009, this leaves the club with \$80,000-\$100,000 to save and/or put towards capital projects. The capital projects listed to be funded in 2009 are stormwater infrastructure, improvements to the clubhouse power system, installation of the northern toilet block and sewerage points, regrading of the southern road and sealing of the northern road. Although these items are approved by the current committee, they are subject to change under the new committee.

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Do you want me to run for treasurer in 2009? I THINK I'M GOING TO NEED SOME HELP!

I am happy to stand again as treasurer IF I AM WANTED, <u>**but**</u>, in electing me you need to be aware of the following...while I enjoy being the treasurer I do also work fulltime and will soon be a mother to two under 18 months! The time I have available for the club is now much less than I had before. Thankfully I have managed to streamline the club's books as much as possible but I am concerned that I will not have enough time to do everything required of the treasurer's role at all times. I think I might need some help. So I am wondering...

Do you want me to stand again as treasurer?

If so, is there a member that can lend me a hand if and when I need it?

If you want me to remain on as treasurer and could give me an hour or three maybe once a month please let me know.

As always, don't hesitate to contact me if you believe any statement you have received is in error. Also, if you have an email address and would like to be included in club email notifications, please drop me a quick email and we'll add you to the SAC newsflash list. I look forward to seeing you at club gatherings throughout 2009.
