From the Secretary's Desk

Hi Everyone

This will be the final Newsletter for the 2012/2013 committee before the Annual General Meeting in March. This year we have had quite a few new members join the club and the following information may be of interest to all regarding how the Annual General Meeting process will unfold.

NOTICE OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting of the NSW Sport Aircraft Club will be held in the Clubhouse Wedderburn on Sunday 10th March following the General Meeting that will begin at 2.00pm.

There are no notices of motion for the AGM.

What is the process for the Annual General Meeting?

The items of business for this meeting include the presentation of the President's Report, a review of the past twelve months, and the presentation of the Club's audited accounts presented by the Treasurer for ratification by the members. All committee positions are then declared vacant and the returning officer and his helpers conduct elections for office bearers and committee members.

Ballot papers will be distributed before the meeting. This usually takes some time so please be patient.

The draft minutes of the 2012 Annual General Meeting are available to read on the Club's website.

Who is eligible to vote?

All full and associate members who have paid their membership fees and charges for the 2013/2014 financial year are eligible to vote. You must have paid these fees before the start of the meeting. It is strongly advised NOT to pay on the day, as this is extremely disruptive for both the returning officer and the Treasurer. All fees should already be paid but if you're running late and intend to vote at the AGM you will need to have paid by Sunday 3rd March. Social membership doesn't include any voting rights.

Who is eligible to stand for a committee position?

All full and associate members who have completed the probationary period of six months and are financial members of the club may nominate for any of the office bearer or committee positions.

How do I nominate for a committee position?

A nomination for this purpose is included in this newsletter. If you would like to nominate for more than one position, please use a separate form for each nomination e.g. if you would like to nominate for President and for a committee position (in case you're not elected as President but would still like to be on the Committee) then each nomination should be on a different form. The committee is made up of 9 members. The positions are as follows:

President Secretary Treasurer 6 committee members.



Please note that the member being nominated, the nominator and the seconder MUST all be financial members of the Club at the time of the nomination. Nomination forms must reach the Secretary by 2.00pm on Sunday 3rd March, 2013 either by post to PO Box 450 Campbelltown 2560 NSW or in person between 1.00 and 2.00 pm in the clubhouse on Sunday 3rd March.

Can I still vote if I can't make it to the meeting in person?

Also included in this newsletter is a Proxy Form. You can use this form if you can't make it to the meeting. Fill in the form and sign it and either send it to the Secretary at the above address or give it to a friend (a fellow club member) to bring to the meeting. You will need to nominate a member to vote on your behalf and there is a section on the form for you to specifically direct your vote if you want to. This is optional. Proxy forms should reach the Secretary before the meeting starts. Only originals will be accepted. Proxy forms cannot be faxed or emailed.

Why would I serve on the committee?

The Club's Management Committee is usually made up of a diverse group of people who bring their individual skill and talents to the job of managing the affairs, finances and infrastructure of the club. There are at least 10 meetings a year as well as 4 general meetings to attend. If you think you have the skills and talents needed and have the time necessary to devote to the task PLEASE nominate for the committee for 2013/2014.





Bird Talk

Hi Everyone,

It is with a touch of sadness I am actually writing my last "Bird Talk" contribution to our club Newsletter.

As most of you know I have given notice of my retirement. Over the next few months I have 2 surgical operations pending so I have decided to place my health first and by doing this I need to relinquish my posi-





I thought I should give you all a little insight as to how my column "Bird Talk" began. Back in 1977 our father Club, The Sport Aircraft Association of Australia (SAAA), held their monthly meetings in the Neil Stewart Room of the Bankstown Aero Club and the Ladies (usually around 12 to 14 were present) always met in the Lounge area to plan Fly-Aways, Air Shows, Raffles, arrange the catering for visiting Pilots from Oshkosh and other states of the USA, book venues for the Presentation dinners (the home builders of aircraft to receive their builders badge) - name it - we did it

In those very early days the Women's Auxiliary was chaired by Margaret Henriksen, a wonderful organiser, great personality and respected by all.

Low and behold out of the blue I was duly elected to take over the Chairmanship after Margaret had resigned in May 1979. I thought no way will I be as capable as Margaret, so with the support of so many wonderful Ladies to help, and by trial and error, we managed to succeed and were delighted with all that we achieved. By taking on the role of Chair of the Ladies Auxiliary (name change in 1981) I never expected I would have to write an article for the SAAA NSW Division Newsletter, so there in June 1979 I wrote my first article called "Birds' Chatter". Seems I changed the name of my article to "Bird Talk" in the July 1979 issue (not sure why) so from 1979 I have



been composing stories about all that was happening around Wedderburn and Bankstown as the Ladies were looking after both SAAA and SAC Social activities.

As SAC was just beginning we needed to raise much needed funds for them so our attention turned to holding many Social evenings, together with outings to various halls to hold Square Dances, trips to theatres to see Aviation Films, we did so much to raise funds I would run out of space in this Newsletter if I tried to mention them all. I also wrote about many of our Ladies birthdays, congratulations when members became Grandparents, our wonderful Patricia Lalor on receiving her Pilot's Licence, members overseas holidays, Charlie Weir becoming

our first Octogenarian, welcoming our new Lady associate members and unfortunately writing about our members who had passed away. I needed to write every possible story I could find to keep our members informed.

At the same time Gordon (1st elected SAC President) commenced writing his article called "Wedderburn Branch News" and he had so much to write about as we were only four months old (Inaugural General Meeting 10th February,1979) so together we had plenty of work to do for our Club.

In the early 80's, SAAA changed the name of their Newsletter to "Fly-Paper Newsletter" so we continued writing for this until SAC decided to print their own Newsletter commencing from August 1985 and so this made it a lot easier to fill up every page with our own Club News.



Over these almost 34 years of being responsible for writing my regular screed for our Newsletter, I enjoyed having the opportunity to "Thank" one and all for giving of their time, energy, donations and most of all support in all they were asked to do to benefit our Club. In all the various activities, be it so many "social do's" we held, (of which there were many) much needed Work Days, Open Days, Camp Quality special days, important social gatherings with our Wedderburn residents and our very good friends from the W.R.F.S. I know we succeeded because of our willing members, relatives and friends being there for us.

It was not just me. The team of Ladies that worked with me, over all these years, were fantastic, dedicated and very special to me and that's what made the difference. Everyone pitched in to make everything work well. Remember we did the "hard yard" for our Club. I cannot

"Thank" them enough for all that they did.

It would be remiss of me not to mention and "Thank" the many Gents who were assisting the Ladies by BBQ cooking, setting up tables and chairs, blowing up balloons, in charge of the Bar, washing up etc, whatever needed to be done they were there for us. To the many members children and grand children who came to be part of the team in recent years, it was wonderful having our Juniors working with us. I certainly appreciated their efforts and I "thank" you all.

I would just like to mention my "right hand" Dorothy McSparron, she was always there for me and

the Club is not the same without her around, we miss her so much. "Thanks" Dot for all your hard work, your loyalty and your friendship.

As I close my final BT "Thank" you all for reading my few words in each Newsletter and it has been a privilege to be so involved with SAC from day one. I have been the lucky one to have met and worked with so many great people over all these years and just to remind everyone I am not leaving the Club I will still be around. I'm just having a well earned rest.

Treasurer's Report

Hi everyone

I hope you all had a great break over the holidays! I managed to get all of the members' invoices out on the 7th January - just before going overseas on holidays for a couple of weeks. If you called me during January and I haven't responded that's my excuse. About 260 invoices and statements were sent by email and only about 25 by "snail mail" (i.e. Australia post). It's obviously a lot quicker and more convenient if you have email. Some of you have indicated you haven't received your invoice - if that's still the case, would you please EMAIL me at **NSWSAC@gmail.com** to let me know - or phone me if you can't email.

I'd like to thank those of you who have paid your dues so promptly - and particularly those who clearly note who the payment is from and who have done me the courtesy of emailing me to let me know you've transferred funds. There are a couple of unidentified payments that have been received. If you are responsible for a cheque deposit on the 10th January for \$464.50 or a direct deposit on the 17th January for \$311 please let me know (preferably by email). If I can't locate the owner of these payments I will, unfortunately, not be able to allocate them to an account. I should also thank those of you who are able to make payments by electronic direct deposit - with nearly 300 members, processing cheques (along with responding to requests to confirm receipt of payment or sending copies of invoices by post) is quite time consuming.

The Club has just entered its new fiscal year (1/2/2013 - 31/1/2014) and we are entering the year in great financial shape. We have had a significant number of new members join the club and we have allocated all available hangar space which has kept our balance sheet strong. On the horizon, once our new lease is confirmed, is a substantial increase in our lease rates to the Commonwealth. We will have to review our membership and hangar fees once we know what the impact of the increase will be. Fortunately, with over 200 full members I don't believe it will be too painful. However, that is a matter for the next committee to address.

On that note, with the election of a new Committee looming in March, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for the privilege of serving you as Treasurer last year. It was my second year in the job and I feel I finally have gotten the hang of it! It has been a rewarding yet demanding role. Given my other business commitments and my multiplying aircraft/helicopter projects, I have decided not to stand for an executive role this year. I would encourage other mem-

bers to consider running as Treasurer and provide will my wholehearted assistance to the incoming Treasurer. I have been nominated for a Committee position and, if elected, would be delighted to serve in that role. One of my frustrations as Treasurer has been that the day-to-day role of looking after the Club's affairs has



precluded me from working on a number of the projects that I think will be of longer-term benefit for the Club and members. It's a case of the urgent taking priority over the important. For example, I would like to implement a Membership System - at present we use a number of Excel and Word documents to record members details. This makes communications difficult, poses a privacy/security risk and makes the Treasurer's role much more cumbersome than it needs to be. A professional system will benefit all members. I'd also like to spend more time thinking about some of the risk management issues facing the Club and how to address these. And, I'd like to get involved in planning for some of the longer term infrastructure needs that members want to see.

At our last Committee meeting, we discussed the importance of renewal of the Committee. I hope you all agree that the leadership and initiative that the President, Secretary and rest of the Committee members have provided has positioned the Club very strongly. However, most of the Committee agree that having new blood on the Committee will allow us to grow stronger and better reflect the wishes of members. With this in mind, I would really like to encourage all of you to consider nominating for a role. I would like to see our newer members take an active role in the growth of the Club. I'd be delighted to talk to any member who is considering nominating (either as treasurer or committee member) - feel free to call me on 0412 404 787.

Suggestions for Interim First Aid Kits

You will all be aware of the accident that happened to Jan Zytka a couple of months ago. This has raised our awareness of the possibility of other similar accidents happening, and which has driven us to seek out some first aid courses and also to get recommendations on appropriate first aid kits for our hangars, our aircraft and for the Clubhouse. Whilst we are getting information about availability and pricing on first aid kits it would be wise to heed some advice sent in from Diane Brookes. She sent in the following:

* * * * *

"I wanted to run past you an idea for a simple first aid kit that ideally could be in every hangar.

This comes from Jan's accident where no clean cloths etc. could be found to stem blood flow.

- Bright Green Plastic Tub with lid i.e. 32 litres size
- 2 clean towels (old towels would be fine)
- various size bandages
- individual saline tubes for washing out eyes etc.

- cheat sheets explaining step by step procedure for burns, CPR etc. maybe in an A4 clear folder
- space blanket

A Nurse friend of mine suggested that if the person in that hangar had a particular medical problem that they could tape their details inside the lid, that could be useful, e.g. if they were diabetic.

With any luck even in the messiest hangar this container could be found and used in serious accidents while help is on the way. I thought this would be a simple and not too expensive option.



Recreational Aviation Australia's Extraordinary General Meeting

Some RAAus ordinary members called for an extraordinary General Meeting, which was held on Saturday 9th February in Queanbeyan. Six SAC members were present. They were Dave Berry, Glenn Buttsworth, Robert Greig, Vic Laybutt, Peter Lightbown, David Rittie.

The main points discussed during the protracted meeting included the following:

- The controversial re-instatement of the President immediately after his resignation.
- The change in policy regarding junior members: no students pilots under the age of 15, no solo flights for students under the age of 16.
- A CASA audit and a series of failed follow-up audits.
- Some deficiencies in the Technical Manager's role and performance.
- Delays in aircraft registration and renewals.
- A request from the floor for more detailed financial reporting and budget planning.
- A series of motions from the floor aimed at improving RAAus management performance and increasing accountability to its members.
- There are currently approximately 100 aircraft awaiting registration and renewals, due to insufficient information available in RAAus files.
- There are some factory-built aircraft with 24-XXX registrations that will need to be re-registered as homebuilt (19-XXX registration) which will make these aircraft ineligible to be used in flying schools. This will include some Lightwing aircraft and some of the Gary Morgan produced series of aircraft.
- IBIS aircraft have also been registered in error. These aircraft may never be registered again in Australia, seriously affecting some flying school activity.
- The RAAus board members were not permitted to make any comment on the death of Carol Smith near Goulburn, due to the legal requirements of a court hearing.
- A minute's silence was observed in honour of lost RAAus members.


