Dangerous Rotor on Runway 3-5

About 12 years ago Vic Laybutt and I were coming in to land on Runway 3-5 in Vic's C177 Cardinal with about a 10 knot nor-westerly wind blowing at the time. As we approached to within 100 metres of the threshold we got pulled down by a rotor to the level of the surrounding trees. Vic needed full power to climb back up to the intended glide path.

Vic tells me that Bruce Cunningham had a similar experience just recently. Please take extra care under these particular conditions.

Complaint from Victoria Road.

Sadly, I must report that we have received another complaint from a resident who lives on Victoria Road, just to the north of our airfield. I mentioned this complaint in a recent Newsflash.

Immediately after the Newsflash was broadcast our member, Peter Reardon, did an internet search using a program that records all transponder transmissions at any selected time. (It may be FlightRadar24.) The results show that no transponder equipped aircraft flew over the



Victoria Road house at the time. There was however, a trace at about the right time, of an aircraft that flew past and over our airfield, and which continued on towards Bankstown. Its flight path was a little to the west of Victoria Road. This tends to indicate that the cause of the complaint was not one of our aircraft.

I put up my hand to do the Secretary job, and also became the Public Officer.

When Margaret vacated the Secretary position after many years, she very kindly brought everything as close as possible to 'up to date', so I've been having fun going through records, minutes etc. to try to get up to speed as soon as possible. It's been quite busy. It has reinforced to me the desperate need we have for a decent membership database--another project for the future!

A quick check of all the Hangar Licence Agreements revealed some discrepancies which will need to be rectified. Some members will be getting letters about this in the near future.

A reminder that any business to be included on the agenda for general meetings will need to be in my

hands at least 14 days before the date of the meeting so the agenda can be organized and publicized.

Putting on my safety hat, with the changeover from daylight saving, it's a good time to do a 6 monthly check of your safety equipment

Replace smoke detector batteries and test.

Foam extinguisher—check pressure is in the green band.



Dry powder extinguisher—check pressure is in the green band and that the powder is not caked. If you can hold the extinguisher against your ear as you invert it (awkward but possible), you will hear the powder inside moving. Give it a good shake to keep the powder loose. If your hearing is like mine, I'd suggest that this test needs to be done somewhere quiet! If the powder doesn't move, then servicing is required.

RFS tell me that hazard reduction burn-offs adjacent to the airfield are still 'on the radar'. There is still quite a backlog from last year, and they are very weather dependent, of course.

There is still a big pile of tree mulch near the southern end of the runway for anyone who wants it. Take as much as you like, then take some more!!

Tim Davis tells us about his Helicopter Ride

During the last SAC Open Day, I was the lucky winner of the choice between a helicopter ride or a lesson on flying a helicopter. Naturally, I chose the lesson.

What follows is my own personal experience and may bear little resemblance to the way one should operate a helicopter.

On 5 March 13, I went out to Bankstown Helicopters at the airport and met my instructor, Ryan Butler. My TIF began by watching a 15 minute video on the principles of helicopter operations. Ryan then gave me a briefing on the controls and what I would be expected to do. As I had thought, I would not be doing any takeoffs or landings and only attempting level flight and perhaps a few turns. After the preflight inspection of the Robinson R22, Ryan took off. This is one of the few easy things about helicopters. You do not have to worry about things like runways.

Once aloft, Ryan demonstrated the four basic controls. The Cyclic (Stick) for Speed and Direction. The Collective that sets Manifold Air Pressure (MAP), the throttle, and the Pedals which control YAW via the tail rotor.

As we approached Homebush, Ryan pulled back on the stick to reduce speed. When we got to 35 knots, I thought we're going to stall! But of course, that's not how a helicopter operates. Ryan first let me use the rudder which is much like that on a fixed wing plane, except you can go around in circles in exactly the same spot if that's what you want to do. Neat! I then tried the cyclic which is like a normal stick in that it banks the helicopter to the left or right. Push the stick forward and you go forward, back and you become stationary or even go backwards. The Collective adjusts the main rotor blade angle to go up and down. Once set, you don't normally have to touch the throttle. Finally, I was allowed to use all the controls, except throttle. I flew straight and made a few mild turns. I would have crashed after 2 minutes if Ryan hadn't grabbed the cyclic. Big Rule - Never take your hand off the cyclic.

After going over Prospect, we headed back to Bankstown. All up, it was a fantastic experience. Got my logbook signed, but don't think I'll be having more lessons. My Jabiru is challenging enough for me. If you can rub your



tummy, pat your head and scratch something else all at the same time, helicopters are for you.

A letter to the Editor from Peter Hodgens

The question I pose is whether we are doing all we can to meet our responsibilities? and I feel sure we are not!

Assuming I am right what would be the outcome of a severe Bushfire.

First of course is that lives could be put at risk. Second is that many Hangars and there contents could be destroyed. Thirdly legal action for damages or worse could ensue, amounting to millions of dollars in claims.

In the event it is proven we have not met our responsibilities, we could be held to have contributed to the tragedy.

At our next general meeting I intend to raise these matters again for discussion. As I imagine some members Will not share my concerns, I encourage all members to attend and have their say.

In conclusion I consider these matters vitally important to the well being of our club.

Let us plan for the worst and hope for the best.


