## From the Secretary's Desk Goings on at Wedderburn

#### Matters on hand

#### **Next General Meeting and Annual General Meeting**

The next General Meeting will be on Sunday March 20<sup>th</sup> 2016 at 2.00 pm.

Any member wishing to add something to the Agenda should advise me in writing before March 13th 2016. The Annual General Meeting will also be on the 20th March, following the GM. At that meeting the committee will stand down and an election will be held to fill those positions. Any Full or Associate Member is entitled to stand for election provided that they are in good financial standing. Nomination Forms for election must be signed by two financial members (Full or Associate) and they have to be in my possession by 2pm on the 13<sup>th</sup> March. You can send them to me c/o the NSW SAC or (quicker) at home on 34 Shiprock Road, Port Hacking, NSW 2229. I will also accept scanned address forms sent jockto my email anderson@bigpond.com. Check with me that I got your nomination in the week before 13<sup>th</sup> March 2016. Any Full or Associate Member is entitled to vote provided that they are in good financial standing but THEY MUST BE THERE AT THE AGM. The club does have postal voting, but **NOT** for election of Office Bearers. For example, if we wanted to change our name (under the Constitution) from NSW Sport Aircraft Club to The Wedderburn Deep Sea Scuba Diving Club we could use postal votes. Proxy voting is not permitted in any circumstances. These are not my rules; they are the Department of Fair Trading's rules.

#### Safety at the Field

A recent accident at the field brought to the attention of Rou that a member, if alone, could be injured and isolated. It is suggested that in addition to all other safety matters, members would be advised to keep a mobile phone within reach when working alone. Some phones have a single "Ring Rou" button on them. That would be a good idea. I used to take a mobile with me when I worked under the cockpit panel near the pedals in case I could not reverse out!

#### Children on a leash

There was a discussion about children on a leash. This is

another safety matter. It was proposed at committee that all children should be on a leash. It was decided not to enforce this provided that the children are closely supervised at all times by a parent, particularly when on the taxiways. They are not to be on the runway at any time.

Instead, it was decided that Errol Pillemer should be on a leash and closely supervised

at all times. Members are urged to report to a committee member if Errol is spotted off the leash.



#### **Keys**

Access via the South (Mine) Gate is now unavailable despite best attempts by the committee. Attempts at a political level are still continuing however. Members will be updated of any progress.

### **Hangar Licence Agreements**

These will be available soon. Some members who store material that contravenes our Head Lease should consider bringing their hangar into compliance now, as the new HLA may not be available in those circumstances. The issue of new keys may be linked to HLA's.

#### Membership database.

It is envisaged that this will be co-ordinated with the issue of new keys to the North Gate. Furthermore they will be indelibly marked with a laser code that will identify the owner, and this will be collated with the members details on the data sheets kept for our records by the Treasurer, Newsletter Editor and Secretary. Don Harvie is looking after this important matter.

#### **Fire Trail Management Committee**

I understand that the club has been granted a seat on the FTMC. Unfortunately it was not in time to influence the access via the South (Mine) Gate but there are other issues to be dealt with, like security, especially to the North where the

cable fence is mostly lying on the ground on the west side. Nobody seems to want to take charge of this problem, especially if it costs.

#### Security at the Field

Members arriving at night via the North Gate may have noticed a light sensor protecting the gate. Several light sensitive and infrared sensitive cameras have been installed to record any illegal activities in the area. You will probably not be able to find the cameras but neither should you have to....they are there for your protection. Rou records a marked drop in these illegal episodes since installation. The committee is constantly reviewing security at the field.

#### **Membership Categories**

The committee is presently reviewing Membership Categories as

some feel that there are too many and that it has become cumbersome. This will be a slow process but members can be reassured that any changes will only apply to future applicants, not to present members.

#### **New Members**

I do not have a record of any new Members since the last newsletter but if you do find any please make them wel-

## Some advice on 'NO GO' AREAS

#### Hi everyone

To those new members (and some older ones who may have forgotten) there are certain areas on the airfield that we should not drive on with a vehicle.

- The most obvious one is the Runway.
- The Grass strip adjoining the runway is also out of bounds.

Less obvious are our water absorption fields: These are:

- in front of the clubhouse.
- at the Northern end below the last hangar Z4, and
- at the Southern end below hangar M1.


These areas have been marked out on the map below.


Visually, they can be easily identified as the grass is greener than the surrounding area. The ground above them can be soft and easily broken with possible damage to the system.

I hereby notify The New South Wales Sport Aircraft Club I intend to place the following motions before the meeting held on the 20<sup>th</sup> March, 2016.

I move that Full Members of the New South Wales Sport Aircraft Club may attend any Committee Meeting as observers only, and can have no input to the proceeds unless invited by the Chairman.

I move that the committee are instructed to remove the By-Law closing the runway on Work Days and replace with the following By-Law.

The runway can only be closed to flying operations when major work is being carried out, or when an emergency of some sort requires closure of the runway.

In the case of major work being required, at least 21 days notice of the closure must be given to members.

On all occasions when the runway is closed due to major work being carried out all markings and other requirements of CASA Regulations are to be strictly adhered too.


## Some more good advice from Phil Ayrton

School holidays and holiday long weekends can be a particularly busy time at Wedderburn, both for members, their guests and their children. There is likely to be an increase in the numbers of pets and of kids on the airfield, so being aware of this and being diligent when operating our aircraft is of paramount importance. The children are likely to want to have some fun, to run around and maybe ride their pushbikes, they can get caught up in the excitement of being at our wonderful facility, out of their usual environment and this is to be encouraged, but parental supervision of kids is also vital to keeping everyone safe. While you're working in your hangar or having coffee with your guests your dog can be tethered but that's not really practical for the children but it is your responsibility to make sure that children associated with you or your group are supervised, that they understand some basic rules and that you know where they are and what they are doing at all times.

Over the Christmas/New Year period there was an incident where a young child was discovered playing on the main runway. When returned to their hangar the father said he had told his child not to go down there, but no further supervision was provided so it was another quick acting member who averted what could have been a very tragic outcome.

Children need to know and understand that despite the lovely rural surroundings what we have is an airport, and that aircraft with engines running can be very dangerous vehicles, that sometimes the pilot may not be able to see them, especially in a tail dragger. Aircraft on taxiways have complete right of way, so if they encounter an approaching aircraft on the hangar taxiways they should move back to the line of the hangar doors taking any items with them to let it pass.

At the northern end of the airfield there is well-established grass between the parallel taxiway and the hangars, so walking along the grass should be encouraged instead of walking down the taxiway, and at the southern end there is the dirt track along the eastern end of hangars that can also be used to get from row to row without having to walk along the parallel taxiway.



Common sense is generally acquired slowly over many years, and the things we may take for granted should be instilled as early as possible in the minds of our children. It might seem like stating the bleeding obvious but it's only obvious to many of us since we've been around facilities like ours for years, so take the time to explain it all and make sure they understand. Peace of mind is cheap and much more satisfying that what could be the unfortunate alternative.

We do want to encourage families to our lovely bush setting, to allow them to enjoy the facility, the trees and the bush we all enjoy but safety should also be in the forefront of everyone's mind all the time. The club tries to remind people of this at every opportunity but visitors in your group are your responsibility and it is your responsibility to ensure they are kept safe, and that reduces the risks for everyone else, meaning that other club members are also kept safer as well. It's vital to making sure that everyone who visits our facility enjoys themselves and can leave with all limbs intact taking just happy memories with them.









# **SAC Annual Christmas Party**







The SAC Christmas party was held in the Clubhouse forecourt, inside a large marquee, which has now become the traditional home for this annual event.
















#### A message from our caretakers, Dawn and Rouen Andrews

## Robert Greig's Memorial Pub Dinner

You will recall that our departed member, Robert Greig, died in an unfortunate accident after flying into cloud. The accident occurred after he attended a regular pub dinner on Tuesday 27th January 2015.

On that terrible day a small group of our members went to the Appin Pub, as they usually do on Tuesdays, to take advantage of the cheap meals available on "Tight Arse Tuesdays" (as the pub so politely calls them). sausages and other food, and some people brought along much more than they needed for themselves so they could share with others.


